<p>With this newsletter your annual Aspen Village Dues Notices are enclosed. Our dues have helped fund many important upgrades in Aspen Village such as the new mailbox posts, replacement and removal of 13 diseased / dead trees, and improved the overall aesthetics of the neighborhood. In addition, they pay for the ongoing maintenance of the neighborhood, mowing of the common areas, snow removal and also utilities.</p> <p><i>Dues must be paid no later than July 1, 2012. Those residents who do not have their dues paid in full on or before this date will be assessed a late fee.</i></p>	<p>Please respect your neighbors and remember these common Aspen Village restrictions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All dogs must be on a leash when outside of a fenced yard.• Trailers/boats should not be on your property outside of your garage for more than 72 hours.• No ATVs are allowed in the common areas or on sidewalks.• Know the restrictions related to fences and sheds. <h3>New Trees</h3>	
<p>13 new trees have been planted throughout the neighborhood. In order to thrive, the new trees must be watered every 3 or 4 days For Several Months. Buckets will be placed at the base of each tree with a slow drain in the bottom (drain over 7 hours).</p> <p><i>We are asking for the nearest residents to the buckets to fill the buckets every 3 or 4 days with water unless we receive substantial rainfall in that time period. This will ensure the trees survive and our neighborhood will stay looking beautiful.</i></p>
